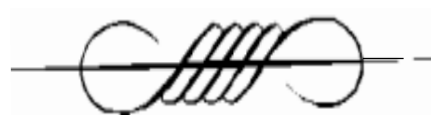

ing support of today's community, we can continue to be an important beacon for the future.

Because of the tight economy that has impacted all non-profits, our spending has been very conservative for the last few years. There has been no money for upgrading the Center or for extras. Last year we even had to stop our cleaning service, with the staff and volunteers pitching in to keep the Center clean. Below is a list of things we would love to have but simply can't afford. Would you consider making a special donation?

- \$75 **Sponsor** small social event (senior social, youth picnic, etc.).

CEO's CORNER

Taking Back The Agenda

Early in the “gay rights” movement and since April 1973 the Pacific Center has been advancing the “homosexual agenda.” And you better believe there’s a homosexual agenda. It’s called equality for all. Social justice for all. And the ALL includes everyone of us. Lesbians. Transgenders. Bisexuals. Gays. Queers. *All* of our unique identities, however they express themselves.

Since 1973 countless numbers of courageous individuals have worked more than a million hours advancing the “homosexual agenda” at the Center. And the agenda has included a huge diversity of peer facilitated support groups that have literally saved hundreds of lives; gave thousands the safety and love to come out of the closet; and best of all, opportunities to find someone to fall in love with and begin a family. It has included mental health counseling for so many individuals, couples, families and groups in emotional pain. It has included powerful and healing programs for our youth. It has included community education by hundreds of strong leaders each telling their story to make our schools, our work sites and our neighborhoods safer. It has included being one of the first agencies to provide support, guidance and education in the plague of HIV and AIDS. And it has included training hundreds of future mental health professionals to provide counseling that respects us and understands the effects of homophobia on our health.

Last year alone over 400 people walked through the Center’s front door each week. 996 came for their counseling appointments. Over 200 came because they needed HIV/AIDS services. Over 300 youth ran up the stairs to a safe place they call the ATTIC so that they could find “family and community” – so that they could finally find themselves. Over 240 people walked into

a room to join their support group to share their challenges, find understanding and celebrate their successes.

How the Pacific Center carries out its mission and does its work is very unique. Each year over 180 lesbians, bisexuals, transgenders, gays and straight allies of all ages and backgrounds come back to the Center to give back. Almost all our services are provided by these giving volunteers. They staff the front desk for three-hour shifts each week. They provide all our mental health and HIV counseling. They facilitate all our 30 plus support groups. They speak at our local schools. They design, help implement and evaluate our youth programs. They train and supervise. They garden. They clean. They donate money. They are our Board of Directors. And more...

An individual called the Center the other week for support and help. The volunteer at the front desk was so responsive that the individual donated \$500 to the Center out of gratitude.

Our youth leaders, called LOUD VOICES, volunteered numerous hours renovating the youth space with new paint, carpeting, furniture and accessories. One of the parents bought all the outside deck furniture. Talk about community ownership!

So at the Pacific Center we are a community serving a community. All of us can be proud of our Center’s successes, growth, stability and dedication. And all of us are needed, in our different ways, for its continued support. Our “agenda” for justice and equality is alive and well at the Center because of you!

Each intern commits to a year-long relationship with the Pacific Center beginning in July or September. Intensive training, supervision and clinical experience comprise each intern's 16-24 hour week.
